During this time, he helped demystify various issues relating to international affairs and defence, and he was a Personal Representative of the Prime Minister of Canada in the fight against *Apartheid*. Namely, he has represented Canada on several delegations to the United Nations and was director of the OECD's Development Cooperation Directorate in Paris for several years.
